Databases and other online portals

Web Access Management System (WAMS) based systems

WAMS allows authorized individuals to access State of Wisconsin Internet applications using the same means of identification for all state web applications. This may be referred to as your WAMS user ID. (Please note this is different from the WILMS ID system listed below). [Sign up for a WAMS account](#). Commonly used systems include Grants and Contracting (GAC) and Secure Public Health Electronic Record Environment (SPHERE).

Wisconsin Logon Management System (WILMS)/SharePoint based systems

REDCap

[DHS REDCap](#) is an online database used to report information on Maternal Child Health (MCH) activities and community engagement. This database requires a Wisconsin Logon Management System (WILMS) account for login.

Partner Communications and Alerting (PCA) Portal

The PCA Portal serves as a [secure resource](#) for **Wisconsin's public health preparedness and response community**. The portal is currently where the majority of guidance, webinars, and training documents are housed regarding COVID-19 response.) You must have a Wisconsin Logon Management System (WILMS) [account](#). Health Officers should determine which staff should have access to the PCA portal and have [them sign up by email](#). If there are staff that do not need access, designating one staff person who can stay up to date on changes, webinars, and ensure highly used documents are shared with all staff is highly recommended. WI Electronic Disease Surveillance System (WEDSS)

[WEDSS](#) is a secure, web-based system designed to facilitate reporting, investigation, and surveillance of communicable diseases in Wisconsin. It is designed for public health staff, infection control practitioners, clinical laboratories, clinics, and other disease reporters. Please be aware that WEDSS documents are located on the WEDSS SharePoint site.
