Social Determinants of Health Defined

The circumstances in which people are born, grow, live, work, and age. These determinants interact with individual behavior and shape the choices that are available to them.

These circumstances are in turn shaped by a wider set of forces including economics, social policies on education and housing, and politics that enhance or impede access to opportunities for health based on social hierarchies of advantage and disadvantage (e.g., race/ethnicity, class, and gender).




Draft Quick Profile of Wisconsin's Metropolitan and Non-Metropolitan Populations





Wisconsin's counties by metropolitan status as proxy for discussion of rural and urban counties







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



Percent of the Projected Population Ages 60 and Older, 2015–2040








Note: The preliminary estimates of the weighted average poverty thresholds for 2022 are calculated by multiplying the 2021 weighted average thresholds from the 2022 Current Population Survey Annual Social and Economic Supplement (CPS ASEC) by a factor of 1.0800273, the ratio of the average annual Consumer Price Index for All Consumers (CPI-U) for 2022 to the average annual CPI-U for 2021. These estimates may differ slightly from the final thresholds that will be published in September 2023 with the release of the official poverty estimates for 2022.


Share of Noninstitutionalized Population Ages 65 and Older With Medicaid/Means-Tested Public Coverage, 2015-19


Social Security as a Share of County Total Personal Income, 2000
