Programs to Meas	sure and Reduce Inconsistency	_

The State has in effect the following programs to measure and reduce inconsistency in the application of survey results among surveyors.

A. Surveyors

- 1. Each new employee participates in a six-month training period covering:
 - A. The federal regulations.
 - B. The state nursing home code.
 - C. The survey process.
 - D. Bureau policies and procedures.
 - E. Wisconsin Statutes, Chapter 50.
 - F. Surveyor role and conduct.
 - G. Bureau organization, function and responsibility.
- 2. Each surveyor goes through one week of federal training covering:
 - A. The federal regulations.
 - B. The federal survey process.
 - C. The federal enforcement process.
- Surveyor Minimum Qualification Test
 - A. This is a test that all state surveyors will be required to pass.

B. Surveys

- 1. All surveys are conducted following the federal survey process as directed in their State Operations Manual (SOM).
 - A. There is also a state issued procedure which describes the survey process that surveyors must allow.

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- 2. All surveys use standard federal survey forms to document the survey findings.
- 3. Surveys are conducted by a team, and all citing decisions are made by the team.
- All citations are made following the Bureau's citing policy, which requires reviewing the scope and severity of each situation before citing.
- 5. Federal look-behind surveys monitor how the state is conducting our surveys.
- 6. Federal SAEP reports monitor all of the various survey and certification functions that are delegated by the federal government.
- C. Bureau Management of the Survey and Certification Agency
 - 1. Field Operations Managers in each regional office review their staffs' survey reports to ensure they are completed accurately per agency procedures.
 - A Quality Assurance Unit monitors the various agency processes to ensure consistency.
 - Statewide citations are reviewed to determine if there are differences between teams or regions, and if there are follow-ups to determine why it is happening, what remedy is needed.
 - 4. For the most serious situations, which are the federal serious and immediate threat and state Class A cities, a conference call with Central Office staff is required before issuing a deficiency.

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
