




1 in 5 Wisconsinites have health care through Medicaid



More than 1 million people get the care they need with Medicaid


- Urgent and emergency care










People of all races get the health care coverage they need from Medicaid

2 of every 5 births in Wisconsin are covered by Medicaid




Coverage includes important prenatal care, childbirth, and postpartum care


