DHS 75.50 outpatient integrated behavioral health treatment service – service description

This is a non-residential treatment service totaling less than nine hours of treatment services per patient per week for adults, and less than six hours of treatment services per patient per week for minors, in which substance use and mental health treatment personnel provide screening, assessment, and treatment for substance use and mental health disorders. Patients in this setting may receive treatment services for a substance use disorder, a mental health disorder, or both. Outpatient integrated behavioral health treatment services may include intake, evaluation and diagnosis, medication management, nursing services, case management, drug testing, counseling, individual therapy, group therapy, family therapy, psychoeducation, vocational services, peer support services, recovery coaching, outreach activities, and recovery support services to ameliorate symptoms and restore effective functioning.

DHS 75.50 outpatient integrated behavioral health treatment service

- This is a new level of care.
- It promotes integrated services for substance use and mental health
- It less than nine hours of treatment services per adult patient per week.
- It is less than six hours of treatment services per minor patient per week.
- It requires a mental health professional to be available during hours of operation of clinical services.
- There is no medical director requirement.

Revised DHS 75 Implementation

Building a better system of care for substance use services

The revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 75 took effect October 1, 2022. This administrative rule sets the minimum standards for substance use prevention, intervention, and treatment services delivered across a variety of settings and levels of care.

The revised Wis. Admin Code ch. DHS 75 is the product of years of partner and provider engagement and advocacy to ensure that DHS administrative rules reflect evidence-based practices and support advancement in patient care. This revised Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 75 puts the health and well-being of people receiving services for substance use first while easing provider requirements to support greater access to substance use services throughout the state.

DHS staff have been providing guidance for the revised regulations since October 2021. Staff continue
