Congratulations!

- You are now certified and trained as a MUSIC & MEMORY facility.
- Your equipment has arrived, or will arrive soon.
- You are ready to implement the program and find your "Henrys."
- We're here to support you.



Implementation

- For the initial seven residents, they must have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's or related dementia **and** they must be Medicaid eligible (this is a criteria because of the funding source).
- Expansion can include any of your residents.
- Use the "Henry" video clip, or the "Alive Inside" film, to encourage buy-in with residents, staff, and families.
- Contact a Phase I or Phase II facility to see if they would be a mentor to you.

Timeline

- May-July 2015: submission and approval of the civil money penalty (CMP).
- October-November 2015: recruit remaining nursing homes.
- December 2015-January 2016: train and certify nursing homes that were recruited.
- January 2016: ship equipment.



Timeline

- January 26, 2016: orientation webinar.
- February-April 2016: full implementation in nursing homes.
- February-December 2016: monthly video conference for support, technical assistance, and sharing of best practices.
- Fall of 2016: evaluation.

- Get started right away.
- Encourage administrator and director of nursing support. Facility wide buy-in is needed (all disciplines).
- Show the "Henry" video to all your staff.



- Help is available. Contact DHS or national Music & Memory.

- Find volunteers to help out with the technology (high school students are great).
 - Building your iTunes library
 - Creating the individual playlists
- Find tech savvy staff within your organization to help with building your library and playlists.



- Directions for iPod use readily available on the units.
- Ensure all staff can assist residents with their personalized music.
- Have iPods available to residents all days, all shifts.
- Base on person-centered assessment, find the right time to provide the music, and then make sure it gets scheduled.
 - At least 30 minutes a day
 - Consider a tracking form
- Don't forget to use when necessary (pro re nata PRN).



- Create a culture. Submit your "Henry" stories to the DHS.
- Contact local news media to capture your success.
- Expand your program with donation drives, events, and collaboration.

National Partnership to Improve Dementia Care

- In 2012, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services launched the National Partnership to Improve Dementia Care.
- As a nation to reduce the use the use of antipsychotic medications by:

	$\underline{\mathbf{WI}}$	<u>U.S.</u>
- 15% by end of 2013	14.5	15.1
- 20% by end of 2014	24.8	20.1
- 25% by end of 2015	28.7 (Q2)	24.8 (Q2)
- 30% by end of 2016	TBD	TBD
