



Your Vote Counts Voter Quick Reference **November 3, 2020 Election**

IMPORTANT DATES

Deadlines to register for November election:

- By Mail or online: Wednesday: October 14
- Deadline to register in person at your municipal clerk's office: October 30
- In-Person: Tuesday, November 3

Early In- person Voting:

Early voting begins October 20. Ask your clerk about early voting locations and hours.

Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot:

- For Regular voters: October 29 @ 5 PM
- For Indefinitely Confined voters: October 30 @ 5 PM
- These are the "legal" deadlines.
 - Request your ballot ASAP. We suggest you request by October 20 to allow time to receive and return your ballot.

Deadline to Return an Absentee Ballot

- Your absentee ballot must be received by 8 PM November 3rd to be counted.
- Complete and return your ballot as soon as possible. If you mail your ballot, allow at least a week for delivery.
- Ask your clerk about other options to return your absentee ballot.

Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM.

You may register and vote at your polling place.

Find your polling place at myvote.wi.gov. Be sure to check - it may have changed.

Be sure to bring your photo ID.
