During the first quarter of the Statewide Expansion CMP Music & Memory grant, the following components of the have taken place:

- Recruitment of four Student Developers
 - One Student Developer hired with a start date of 8/14/17 and will be located at UW-Eau Claire.
 - Active interviews for Milwaukee based Student Developer expect to be located at Cardinal Stritch.
 - Ongoing recruitment in the northeast and northwest regions of the state
- In collaboration with the DHS, created a video on April 5, 2017, demonstrating the Music & Memory student volunteer program at Mary Jude nursing home featuring HOSA students from West Allis High School.
