Skilled Nursing Facilities Dental Care Survey

In October 2021, the Department of Health Services' Oral Health Program surveyed Administrators and Directors of Nursing at all of Wisconsin's Skilled Nursing Facilities. With a response rate of 50.4%, the intent of the survey was to learn about the needs and experiences of providing dental care to residents of nursing facilities.



19% of respondents reported obtaining dental care is very or extremely difficult.



35% of respondents noted that quite a few or most of their new residents have unmet dental needs.



14% of respondents reported that dentists and dental hygienists never visit their facility.

Greatest barriers to optimal oral health

- Access to care issues due to insurance coverage or geography
- Dental workforce bandwidth like scheduling issues or staff availability
- Resident associated issues like underlying comorbid conditions, care refusal, or inability to engage in care

36% of respondents reported they were very or extremely interested in having a hygienist always on staff.



41% of respondents reported they were very or extremely interested in contracting with a hygienist.


