
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New COVID-19 Cases

7-day average of 183 cases per day (8/15/23)


7-day average data on last webinar (5/9): 178 cases per day

Hospitalizations and Hospital Capacity



Wastewater Surveillance

- Wastewater monitoring for COVID-19
- Early warning sign for COVID-19
- Targeted and quicker public health responses

CDC Community Levels

CDC Community Levels have been retired

Moving forward, data on COVID-19 hospitalizations will be the primary surveillance indicator to guide community and individual decisions

CDC Hospital Admission Levels

Individual-Level Prevention Steps



LOW, MEDIUM, AND HIGH

At all COVID-19 hospital admission levels:

- <u>Stay up to date</u> on vaccination.
- Maintain <u>ventilation improvements.</u>
- Avoid contact with people who have suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- Follow recommendations for <u>isolation</u> if you have suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- Follow the recommendations for <u>what to do if you are exposed</u> to someone with COVID-19.
- If you are at <u>high risk of getting very sick</u>, talk with a healthcare provider about additional prevention actions.

CDC Hospital Admission Levels (Cont.)

Individual-Level Prevention Steps



MEDIUM AND HIGH

When the COVID-19 hospital admission level is Medium or High:

- If you are at <u>high risk of getting very sick</u>, wear a high-quality mask or respirator (e.g., N95) when indoors in public.
- If you have household or social contact with someone at high risk for getting very sick, consider self-testing to detect infection before contact, and consider wearing a high-quality mask when indoors with them.



HIGH

When the COVID-19 hospital admission level is High:

- Wear a high-quality mask or respirator.
- If you are at high risk of getting very sick, consider avoiding non-essential indoor activities in public where you could be exposed.

CDC Hospital Admission Levels (Cont.)

Community-Level Prevention Steps



LOW, MEDIUM, AND HIGH

At all COVID-19 hospital admission levels:

- Promote equitable access to vaccination, testing, masks and respirators, treatment and prevention medications, community outreach, and support services.
- Ensure access to testing, including through point-of-care and at-home tests for all people.
- Maintain <u>ventilation improvements.</u>
- Provide communications and messaging to encourage isolation among people who test positive.

CDC Hospital Admission Levels (Cont.)

Community-Level Prevention Steps



MEDIUM AND HIGH

When the COVID-19 hospital admission level is Medium or High:

• Implement screening testing in high-risk settings where screening testing is recommended.




HIGH


When the COVID-19 hospital admission level is High:

• Implement healthcare surge support as needed.
