Categories Based on 2020 Census of County Population Levels

*A Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) consists of a large population center and the adjacent communities that are economically and socially integrated with that center. An entire county or group of counties constitutes an MSA. Wisconsin had 27 metropolitan counties in 15 distinct MSAs.

A Micropolitan Statistical Area (μ SA) is a geographic region containing at least one urban area with a population between 10,000 and 50,000 and may consist of one or more counties. Wisconsin had 13 micropolitan counties in 12 distinct μ SAs.

All other Wisconsin counties (32) are classified as rural.
