<b>Indicator</b>	Motor vehicle crash deaths and incapacitating injuries
<b>Demographic Group</b>	Wisconsin residents
<b>Numerator</b>	People (including non-residents) killed or incapacitated as a result of motor vehicle crashes in Wisconsin.
<b>Denominator</b>	Wisconsin population
<b>Details about Data Item</b>	<p>The tables show total numbers of people killed or incapacitated and rates of death and incapacitation per 100,000 population. An incapacitating injury is defined as a non-fatal injury that prevents a person from walking, driving or performing other activities that s/he was able to perform before the crash occurred (<i>Wisconsin Traffic Crash Facts</i> (annual), Wisconsin Department of Transportation).</p> <p>Data were provided by the University of Wisconsin Center for Health Systems Research and Analysis (CHSRA) and were computed using linked Department of Transportation data and Wisconsin hospital discharge data.</p>

<b>Data Source</b>	Wisconsin Crash Outcome Data Evaluation System (CODES), Center for Health Systems Research and Analysis (CHSRA).
