



What is TrainingFinder Real-time Affiliate Integrated Network (TRAIN)?

- TRAIN is a one-stop learning management system for professionals who protect and promote the public's health. Twenty-five states, the Medical Reserve Corp, Health Resources Service Administration (HRSA), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the CDC's Division of Global of Quarantine and Migration subscribe to TRAIN. As of June 1, 2013, nation-wide there are:
 - 708,813 registered learners
 - 3,281 course providers
 - 32,661 active courses

Why TRAIN Wisconsin?

- Subscribers share maintenance costs, managed by the Public Health Foundation (PHF) and state-designated administrators.
- TRAIN has unlimited user, course provider, and course posting capacity (no licenses required).
- Course curriculum is developed and shared throughout the nation.
- Courses are available in multiple formats, many online at no charge resulting in significant cost savings.
- TRAIN stores course transcripts and certificates for both TRAIN and non-TRAIN events.
- Learning needs are targeted; courses may be browsed by competency.
- Course providers enjoy national promotion with rating scales for TRAIN users to evaluate and view.
- Course provider features include: course rosters, wait lists, auto-email verifying registration, certificates, sign-in sheets, mailing labels, name badges, and mass or individual emails.

Who uses TRAIN Wisconsin?

- TRAIN serves the broadly defined public health workforce - all those who provide essential public health services.
- This workforce includes individuals from public and private, tribal, governmental and non-governmental agencies.
- As of July 31, 2013, TRAIN Wisconsin Metrics showed:
 - 35,743 are registered TRAIN learners; 32,651 had taken at least one course.
 - 9,366 learners have logged into TRAIN in the past 12 months; 7,372 have taken at least one course.
 - There are 176 course providers and 394 active Wisconsin courses.

Chart 1: TRAIN User Demographics: Education

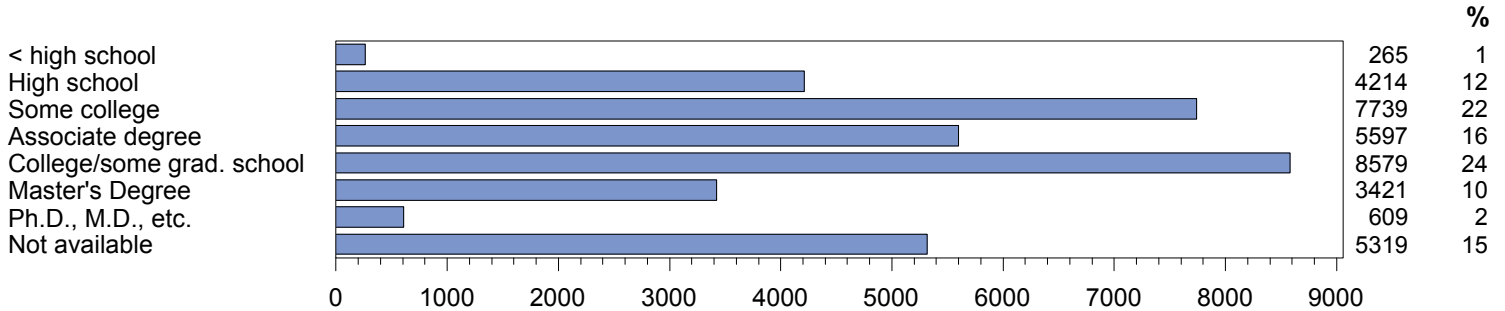
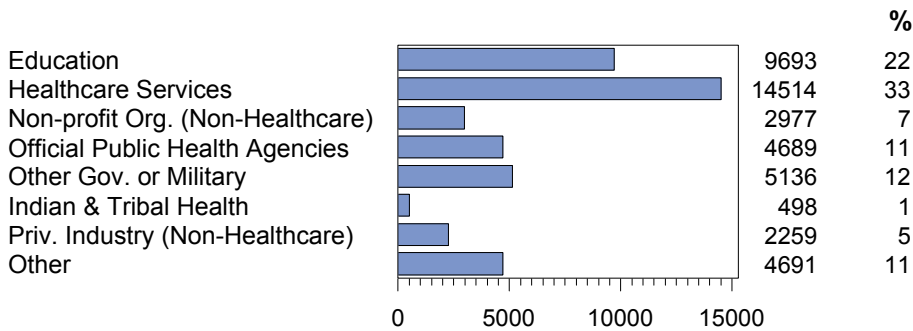
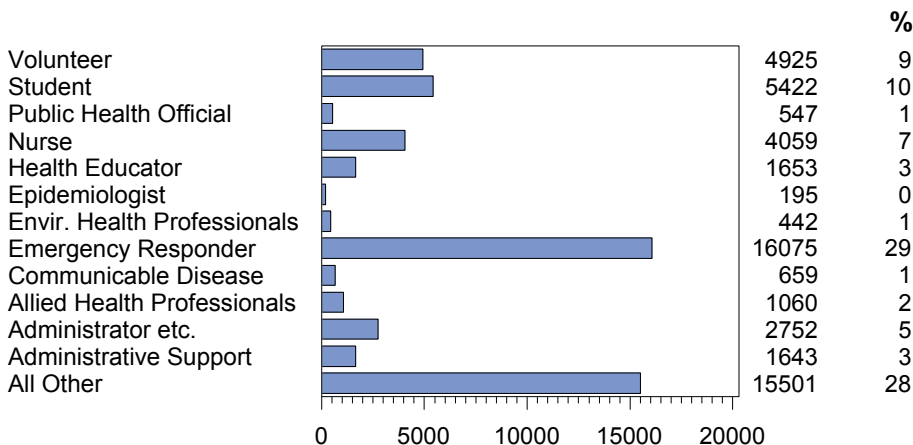


Chart 2: TRAIN User Demographics: Job Settings
