

WISCONSIN EMS SCOPE OF PRACTICE BASIC FIRST AID



This level of provider will have successfully completed a basic first aid program of training. There are no testing requirements other than those of the class/course provider. No State of Wisconsin license is required and no re-training is required, although CPR recertification should be accomplished at regular two-year intervals.

Any individual or service whose primary response is to provide medical care must be trained and licensed at the Emergency Medical Responder level or above. Conversely, if an entity responds for police calls, fire suppression or extrication and the provision of first aid is secondary, first aid training is sufficient.
