## Local Services Supported Through Ryan White Part B Funding

This issue of *Wisconsin AIDS/HIV Program Notes* highlights current services in Wisconsin that are provided by local agencies and supported under Part B of the federal Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act of 2006.

## Introduction

Congress created the Ryan White CARE Act in 1990 in response to calls for assistance from a number of urban public hospitals in the U.S. that were struggling financially from uncompensated care provided to individuals dying of AIDS. The Act was named for Ryan White, a teenager who contracted HIV through a blood transfusion and died after an eight-year struggle with the disease.

The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act covers a series of grant programs that fund treatment services for people with HIV/AIDS who are either uninsured or underinsured. In 2007, over 6,200 residents in Wisconsin benefited from services supported under Ryan White funding. The federal agency responsible for administering the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act is the <u>Health Resources and Services Administration</u> (HRSA). Part B of the Modernization Act provides funding to all 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and five U.S. Pacific Territories or Associated Jurisdictions.

In addition to the services highlighted in this article, Part B funding supports the Wisconsin <u>AIDS/HIV Drug Assistance Program</u> and the <u>Wisconsin AIDS/HIV Health</u> <u>Insurance Premium Subsidy Program</u>.

## Local Services Supported Through Ryan White Part B

During the 2008 Ryan White project year (April 1, 2008 - March 31, 2009), the Wisconsin Division of Public Health (DPH) has contracted \$2,427,700 to twelve agencies to provide HIV/AIDS treatment services. Contracts focus on the provision of "core medical services" as defined by HRSA and comprising the following:

• **Outpatient/ambulatory medical care**: Professional diagnostic and therapeutic services rendered by a physician, physician's assistant, clinical nurse specialist, or nurse practitioner in an outpatient setting.

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- **Oral health care**: Diagnostic, preventive, and therapeutic services provided by general dental practitioners, dental specialists, dental hygienists and auxiliaries, and other trained primary care providers.
- **Mental health services**: Psychological and psychiatric treatment and counseling services for individuals with a diagnosed mental illness and provided by a State licensed or authorized provider.
- **Substance abuse services**: Medical or other treatment/counseling to address substance abuse problems in an outpatient setting, rendered by a physician or under the supervision of a physician or other qualified personnel.

In addition to core medical services, local agencies also provide HRSA-defined support services, including psychosocial case management, legal services, treatment adherence counseling, emergency financial assistance, and food bank and home delivered meals.
