Standard Utility Credit Information

What is a standard utility credit?

A standard utility credit is a fixed dollar amount that is subtracted from your household's gross income used to determine the amount of FoodShare benefits you get. You get a standard utility credit when you pay for certain types of utilities separately from your rent, such as heat, water, phone, or electric.

During your FoodShare interview, you should report to your worker which types of utilities you pay. You may be asked to provide proof of the utilities you pay in the form of bills or statements from the utility company.

Wisconsin calculates standard utility credits yearly based on average utility costs in the state.

What standard utility credit am I eligible for?

The types of utilities you pay separate from your monthly rent will determine which standard utility credit you are eligible for. You only get one standard utility credit per year, so if you are eligible for multiple credits, you will get the highest credit available.

For example, if you pay a heating bill and a phone bill, you will get the heating standard utility credit of \$538. If you pay both a water bill and a cell phone bill, you will get the limited utility credit of \$375.

Note: Cable and internet are not counted as allowable utilities. Please see the table on page 2 for more details on standard utility credits.

How do standard utility credits affect the amount of FoodShare benefits I get?

If you are eligible for a standard utility credit, the credit amount is subtracted from your household's gross monthly income. Additional credits for shelter, dependent care, and child support may also be subtracted from your household's gross monthly income to get your net income. Your FoodShare benefit amount is based on your net income and the number of people in your home.
