*A Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) consists of a large population center and the adjacent communities that are economically and socially integrated with that center. An entire county or group of counties constitutes an MSA. Wisconsin had 25 metropolitan counties in 15 distinct MSAs.

All other Wisconsin counties (47) are included in the nonmetropolitan category. Nonmetropolitan counties that have a population greater than 40,000 are classified as urban. All other nonmetropolitan counties are classified as rural.
