Opioid and Methamphetamine Treatment Centers: 2026 Report to the Legislature

Overview

This report covers the calendar year 2025 activities of the six opioid and methamphetamine treatment programs created under Wis. Stat. § 51.422.

A total of 1,003 people were served in 2025. Services were provided through in-person visits and telehealth technology.

Three opioid and methamphetamine treatment centers were established under 2013 Wisconsin Act 195. Three additional locations were established under 2017 Wisconsin Act 27. The total funding available for this program in calendar year 2025 was \$3,015,996.

These agencies provide substance use treatment services for people with an opioid use disorder or methamphetamine use disorder to reduce the harm associated with use.

The treatment services include contingency management therapy, counseling, the Matrix Model, medications for opioid use disorder, and peer support.

The terms of their grant award require each grantee to report on the total number of people served, including pregnant people served. Each grantee also must report the referral source, gender, age, race/ethnicity, education level, drug of use at time of admission, payer source, and employment status at time of admission for each person served.

There were no discharges from treatment services due to overdose deaths in 2025.
