

Role of DDB

- → DDB determines medical eligibility of applicants for:
 - Social Security disability programs
 - · Medicaid disability programs
- → If medical records are not sufficient, DDB purchases a consultative examination to obtain objective medical findings as required by Social Security regulations.
- → DDB considers the consultative examination findings, along with the totality of evidence in the applicant's file, to make a medical eligibility determination

Benefits of Joining the Consultative **Examination Panel**

- → Flexible scheduling:
 - No holidays
 - · Weekends optional
- → Timely payments from DDB within 30-45 days.
- → No ongoing treatment relationship with the applicant.
- → Electronic report submission option with a free teledictation service

Role of the Consultation **Examination Provider**

- → Appointments are scheduled approximately 14 days in the future.
- → Following the provided Social Security Administration protocol, you complete your examination, then submit your signed narrative report to DDB within 10 days.
- → You do not make the medical eligibility determination.

- → You must be licensed and in good standing in your field.
- → A willingness to evaluate the full age range of applicants within your specialty is valued.
- → Bilingual abilities are preferred.
