WHAT WE DO





CASES BY MECHANISM OF INJURY




OVER 40% OF TRAUMA INJURIES ARE RELATED TO FALLS.

*Data Limitations: Patients transferred to another hospital for a higher level of care may be in the trauma registry twice.



MOST TRAUMA CASES OCCUR IN THE EARLY 20S OR AT AGE 80 AND ABOVE.


TRAUMA PATIENT DISCHARGE DESTINATION



Above: Up until age 70, the majority of trauma cases are male. Most trauma cases age 70 and older are female.

Left: 60% of trauma patients are discharged home or to an additional hospital for short-term stay.

CASES BY INJURY SEVERITY SCORE (ISS)



ISS SCORES GREATER THAN 15 ARE CONSIDERED MAJOR TRAUMA.

80% OF TRAUMA CASES WERE NOT CONSIDERED A MAJOR TRAUMATIC INJURY.
