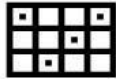


Workplace Deaths

114

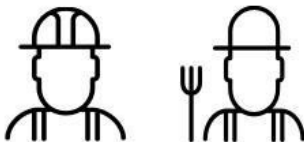
Wisconsin workers died at work in 2012.

one worker died after being hurt at work.

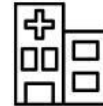
47% of work deaths occurred in construction, farming, and transportation.
