

Public School District Immunization Rates, Wisconsin, 2022-2023 School Year

Every fall, in accordance with the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law, schools report the aggregate student compliance with the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law to the public health department.

Students are in compliance with the law if they meet the minimum immunization requirements, are in the process of meeting the requirements, or have a signed waiver. The 'By District' tab contains the results reported for public school students, by school district, for the 2022-2023 school year.

Below are descriptions of the data included on the 'By District' tab.

District Name	Name of school district, as on file with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction
School Name	Name of school, as on file with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction
% Met Minimum Requirements*	Percent of public school students in all grades that met all of the minimum immunization requirements
% In Process	Percent of public school students in all grades that were in process
% Behind Schedule	Percent of public school students in all grades that were behind schedule
% No Record	Percent of public school students in all grades that had no record
% Health Waiver	Percent of public school students in all grades that had a health waiver
% Religious Waiver	Percent of public school students in all grades that had a religious waiver
% Personal Conviction Waiver	Percent of public school students in all grades that had a personal conviction waiver
% Waived All Vaccines	Percent of public school students in all grades that received no immunizations and had a waiver for all vaccines
Kindergarten: % Met Minimum Requirements*	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that met all of the minimum immunization requirements
Kindergarten: % In Process	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that were in process
Kindergarten: % Behind Schedule	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that were behind schedule
Kindergarten: % No Record	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that had no record
Kindergarten: % Health Waiver	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that had a health waiver
Kindergarten: % Religious Waiver	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that had a religious waiver
Kindergarten: % Personal Conviction Waiver	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that had a personal conviction waiver
Kindergarten: % Waived All Vaccines	Percent of public school students in Kindergarten that received no immunizations and had a waiver for all vaccines

*For students in grades K-12, the minimum immunization requirements for attending a Wisconsin school include: 4 doses of DTaP vaccine, 4 doses of polio vaccine, 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine, 2 doses of MMR vaccine, 2 doses of varicella vaccine, and (for grades 6-12) 1 dose of Tdap vaccine.

Notes:

Parents provide student immunization records to schools. Schools aggregate this information and report the information to public health during the fall of each school year. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services does not have the ability to verify the accuracy of the information that was submitted by schools.

The data in this document display school immunization and waiver rates and should not be used to determine the percent of students who were in compliance with the law.
