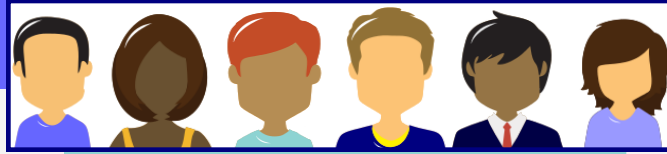


HIV Facts:

Undetectable

What does it mean?



Undetectable:

It means a person living with HIV has a very small amount of HIV in their blood, usually because of HIV treatment. It does not mean they are cured.

Tell me more:

A **viral load** is the amount of HIV in the blood of a person living with HIV. The higher the viral load, the easier it is to pass on HIV to others. If someone is **virally suppressed** (less than ~200 copies/ml) or **undetectable** (less than ~40 copies/ml) it means they will not pass HIV to another person through sex.



Yes, it is true. **Finding the right treatment plan for you or someone you love can mean not passing HIV on to sex partners.**
