#### Nutrition in children and adolescents

Increasing optimal nutrition and physical activity in children and adolescents



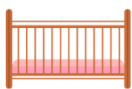
#### Nutrition in infants and young children

Increasing optimal infant and early childhood nutrition (including breastfeeding)



#### Developmental screening

Increasing developmental screening rates and appropriate follow-up after concerning result



#### Safe sleep

Increasing infant safe sleep practices



#### Depression screening

Increasing depression screening rates among adolescents and young adults and appropriate follow-up after concerning result

### Join the Adolescent and Child Health Steering Team

The Adolescent and Child Health Steering Team is facilitated by the Wisconsin Collaborative for Healthcare Quality (WCHQ). The Department of Health Services, Maternal and Child Health Program provides funding to support the Adolescent and Child Health Steering Team.

Participants benefit from networking with peers, education from subject matter experts, and rapid-cycle improvement work. WCHQ staff use group learning and collective impact methods to support members' practice transformation goals and drive improvement across the state.
