

Services Overview

Children's Long-Term Support Program and Adult Long-Term Care Programs

Transitioning from the Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) Program to adult long-term care (LTC) programs such as IRIS (Include, Respect, I Self-Direct) and Family Care can be challenging. Support and Service Coordinators (SSCs) can use this resource to help families get ready by providing basic information and common terminology. It is not intended to be given to families without a conversation, nor is it a benefits counseling tool or crosswalk.

SSCs can use the information before referring to an aging and disability resource center (ADRC) to:

- Introduce the concept of transition planning early, especially when families express curiosity about adult services.
- Prepare families for the eligibility determination process or benefits counseling through an ADRC.
- Help families understand the types of services available in adult LTC.
- Empower families to think about their needs and get answers to their questions.

Support Services

Support services help participants both in community settings and in their homes.
