Reproductive Rights for Teens

What are reproductive rights?

Even if you're under 18, you have the right to get reproductive health care without permission from your parents or guardians.

Reproductive health care includes anything related to your sexual health, including pregnancy and STI prevention.

It also means having access to medically accurate health information.

What are some examples of reproductive rights that are accessible to young people?

- Exams and care related to reproductive health
- Contraceptive services (birth control, condoms, etc.)
- STI and HIV testing and treatment
- Pregnancy-related care

The role of your medical provider:

- Your medical provider is here for you, even if the conversation feels uncomfortable at times.
- You have the right to confidentiality. Anything told to a health care provider will not be shared outside of the health care team, unless there is reason to believe someone is in immediate danger.
