

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Someone to Talk to

The services in the table below are available statewide.

Program/Service	Description	Funding
Peer-Run Warmline	Call, text, or chat with individuals with related life experiences for non-emergency support/before situations are an emergency. Service expected to be available in 2023.	American Rescue Plan Act through September 2025.
988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline	Call, text, or chat to connect with a counselor.	Federal grants through September 2025.
HOPELINE™	Text with operators trained to provide emotional support and resources.	State general purpose revenue and the Center for Suicide Awareness.
County Crisis Lines	Call to talk to behavioral health professionals or trained volunteers during an emergency.	County budgets and Medicaid reimbursements.

Someone to Respond

The services in the table below are available in select areas of Wisconsin based on local support.

Program/Service	Description	Funding
County Mobile Crisis Response + Enhanced Response Teams	At least one first responder or behavioral health professional responding in person to deescalate and provide support. Enhanced Response Teams: A group of up to three first responders and/or behavioral health professionals responding in person during an emergency.	County budgets and Medicaid reimbursements.
Co-Responder Models	Provide mobile response using law enforcement AND behavioral health professionals for individuals during an emergency.	Municipal budgets.

A Safe Place to Be

The services in the table below are available in select areas of Wisconsin. It's the intent to have all services available regionally with additional funding.

Program/Service	Description	Funding
Youth Crisis Stabilization Facilities	Residential settings that provide counseling, therapy and other services to youth (ages 17 and under) for up to 30 days.	State general purpose revenue and federal grants.
Private & Public Hospitals	Facility settings that provide intensive inpatient care and treatment from behavioral health professionals.	Patient payments, private insurance, Medicaid payments.
Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities	Non-hospital settings for youth that would offer intense, focused treatment to promote a successful return home or to a less-restrictive community setting.	Funding needed. (State budget proposal.)
Crisis Urgent Care & Observation Centers	Facility settings, similar to hospital emergency departments, that would offer assessment and support from behavioral health professionals.	Funding needed. (State budget proposal.)
