SHIP screens, trains, and certifies all volunteers in Medicare, so you don't need a background in health insurance to get involved. All you need is integrity, a willingness to learn, and a desire to help others.

Volunteers are provided education and ongoing support, including:

- New volunteer training and certification.
- Annual updates training.
- Mentorship.
- Support from Medicare experts.

Initial training includes about 12 hours of online, self-paced modules and 15 hours of live webinar trainings. Medicare updates training can be about 12 hours a year.

What is the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)?



SHIP is a national program that offers one-on-one assistance, counseling, and education to Medicare beneficiaries to help them make informed decisions about their care and benefits.



Navigating Medicare is complicated, but SHIP can help by answering questions and providing personalized guidance to those who need it. SHIP is grant-funded; counselors don't sell anything and aren't affiliated with any private company or plan.
