## BadgerCare Plus and Wisconsin Medicaid

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If your family has BadgerCare Plus, your benefits will end when you turn 19. This means that the cost for doctor's appointments, hospital visits, or medicine won't be covered by health insurance. Avoid costly medical bills and make sure you have other insurance lined up before you turn 19.

## Get the coverage you need

Find the health insurance that's right for you.


- BadgerCare Plus. To keep getting BadgerCare Plus, you must qualify based on your income. Go to access.wi.gov to apply for benefits.
- Student health plan. Are you enrolled in a college or university? Your school might have health insurance options. Check with them to see what's available.
- Employer insurance. If you have a job, your employer may offer health insurance. Also, if one of your parents has insurance through an employer, you might be able to be on their plan until you turn 26. Check with the company's human resource department for details.
- HeathCare.gov. If you can't get BadgerCare Plus or employer insurance, check out options at HealthCare.gov. You might be able to get coverage with either no monthly cost or a small premium.

Whatever you choose, don't wait! An unexpected medical situation can happen at any time; you'll want to be prepared.
