## COVID-19 vaccines are available free of charge to everyone.





## If you have health insurance

Most plans cover the cost of the COVID-19 vaccine, check with your health insurance provider.

- ◆ If your plan covers the cost, find a COVID-19 provider on <u>vaccines.gov</u> or talk to your health care provider.
- If your plan does not cover the cost, you can get a vaccine for free through the **Vaccines for Children** program or the **Bridge Access Program**.



## If you are 19 and older and don't have health insurance, or your insurance does not cover the cost

You can get a COVD-19 vaccine for free from a Bridge Access Provider (BAP).

 Find a BAP provider at <u>vaccines.gov</u>. Enter your zip code and the vaccine you are looking for, and choose "Bridge Access Program Participant."



## If you are under 19 and don't have health insurance, or your insurance does not cover the cost

You can get a COVID-19 vaccine for free at a Vaccines for Children provider.

- VFC providers give vaccines to children under 19 at no cost if they are eligible for Medicaid, are American Indian or Alaska Native, or are uninsured or under insured. Find a VFC provider on <a href="mailto:dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/vfc-provider.htm">dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/vfc-provider.htm</a>.
  - ◆ Not all VFC locations are able to provide vaccines for people with private insurance that does not cover vaccines. Check with the VFC provider.
  - Medicaid members under age 19 may also receive a COVID-19 vaccine from a Medicaid enrolled pharmacy who does not participate in the VFC program through December 1, 2024.
