

# COVID-19 vaccines are available free of charge to everyone.



## If you have health insurance

Most plans cover the cost of the COVID-19 vaccine, check with your health insurance provider.

- ◆ If your plan covers the cost, find a COVID-19 provider on [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) or talk to your health care provider.
- ◆ If your plan does not cover the cost, you can get a vaccine for free through the **Vaccines for Children** program or the **Bridge Access Program**.

## If you are 19 and older and don't have health insurance, or your insurance does not cover the cost

You can get a COVID-19 vaccine for free from a **Bridge Access Provider (BAP)**.

- ◆ Find a BAP provider at [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov). Enter your zip code and the vaccine you are looking for, and choose "Bridge Access Program Participant."

## If you are under 19 and don't have health insurance, or your insurance does not cover the cost

You can get a COVID-19 vaccine for free at a **Vaccines for Children** provider.

- ◆ VFC providers give vaccines to children under 19 at no cost if they are eligible for Medicaid, are American Indian or Alaska Native, or are uninsured or under insured. Find a VFC provider on [dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/vfc-provider.htm](https://dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/vfc-provider.htm).
  - ◆ Not all VFC locations are able to provide vaccines for people with private insurance that does not cover vaccines. Check with the VFC provider.
  - ◆ Medicaid members under age 19 may also receive a COVID-19 vaccine from a Medicaid enrolled pharmacy who does not participate in the VFC program through December 1, 2024.
