Who can see a benefit specialist?

You can get help from a benefit specialist if you:

- Are an adult with a disability or age 60 or older.
- Live in Wisconsin.
- Are a legal guardian of an eligible person.

Get expert advice.

A benefit specialist can help you:

- Advocate on your behalf with other parties.
- Apply for programs that will save you money.
- File appeals when you are denied disability, health care or drug coverage, or other benefits.
- Learn about health insurance options, money-saving benefit programs, or solutions to other problems.
- Refer you to an attorney when necessary.
