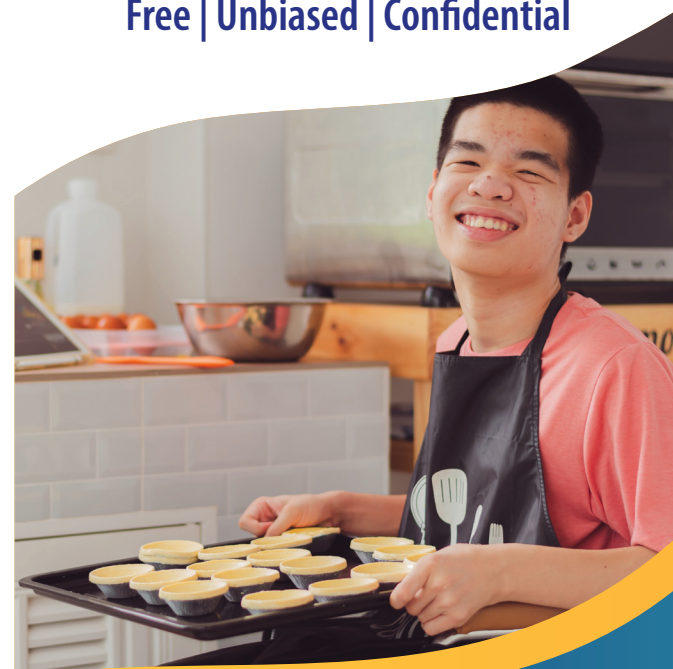

Your local DBS can help you access benefits that may:

- Increase your income.
- Pay for your health care and medications.
- Reduce your expenses.

Who can see a DBS?

You can get help from your local DBS if you:

- Are a legal guardian of an eligible person.
- Have a disability.
- Live in Wisconsin.

Get expert advice.

Your DBS can help you:

- Advocate on your behalf.
- Apply for programs that will save you money.
- Compare options for health insurance, benefit programs, or solutions to an issue.
- File appeals when you are denied disability benefits, health care or drug coverage, or other benefits.
- Refer you to an attorney when necessary.
