Renovation Work in an Old Building? Lead dust may be in the area.

Teachers and staff, lead renovation work makes your school safer, but there may be temporary **lead dust hazards.** Both kids and adults can be affected.

Lead exposure can affect:

- Pregnancy and reproductive health.
- Risk for cancer, heart attack, and stroke.
- Sleep quality and mood.

Here's how you can stay safe:

- **Get trained on lead hazards.** Lead can be in pipes and other surfaces besides paint.
- **Don't enter work zones,** and make a report if you see unsafe renovation practices.
- Safely manage dust and paint chips. Use wet wipes on frequently-used surfaces.
- Avoid disturbing peeling paint. Be careful when putting up posters or decorations.
- **Wash your hands** before eating, drinking, or touching your mouth or face.
- **Don't take lead home.** If you think you've been exposed to lead dust, do the following when you get home:
 - Take off your shoes.
 - Change clothes.
 - Shower.
