



Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus Tuberculosis-Related Only Services

Tuberculosis-Related Only Services is a health care plan for people who have been diagnosed with tuberculosis but do not meet the rules to enroll in Wisconsin Medicaid or BadgerCare Plus. The Tuberculosis-Related Only Services plan helps pay some medical costs for the care of tuberculosis (TB) infection or TB disease.

To enroll in this plan, a person must meet income and asset rules and have been infected with TB. For one person, the monthly gross income limit is \$1,555 and the asset limit is \$2,000 or less.

For a child younger than 19 years old living at home, some of the parents' income and assets may be counted. If someone is married, some of their spouse's income or assets may be counted.

Tuberculosis-Related Only Services only covers services directly related to the care of TB. These include:

- Physician services.
- Prescription drugs.
- Laboratory tests and X-rays.
- Clinic services.
- Targeted case management services.
- Services designed to encourage completion of treatment.
- Services needed due to side effects of prescribed drugs for TB care.

Note: This plan does not pay for hospital stays or room and board.
