

Temporary health insurance for pregnant women is available through BadgerCare Plus. You may be able to get temporary health insurance for pregnancy-related services, for up to two months, before you apply for regular BadgerCare Plus through your local county or tribal agency.

### **Women Who Can Get Temporary Health Care**

Your pregnancy must be verified by a health care provider, your family's gross monthly income must be at or below the income limit for temporary health insurance and you must meet all other program rules.

*Family Size	Income Limit
1	\$2,917.50
2	\$3,932.50
3	\$4,947.50
4	\$5,962.50

\*For each additional person add \$1,015.

### **Covered Services**

Temporary health insurance for pregnant women will pay for outpatient pregnancy-related services, including:

- Doctor Visits
- Immunizations
- Prescription drugs
- Lab and x-ray services
- Dental care

### **How To Get Temporary Health Insurance**

If you already have a health care provider, call and ask if s/he can use Express Enrollment to help you get temporary health insurance through BadgerCare Plus. If not, call 1-800-362-3002 and they will find a BadgerCare Plus provider for you.

If you're able to be enrolled, your temporary health care benefits will start the same day you apply with your BadgerCare Plus provider. Your benefits will continue through the last day of the next month.

For example: If your BadgerCare Plus provider enrolls you on June 6, your coverage will last until July 31.

### **Apply Today**

Because temporary BadgerCare Plus lasts 60 days or less and doesn't pay for all pregnancy related services, you should apply for regular BadgerCare Plus with your local county or tribal agency as soon as possible.

Note: Temporary health insurance through BadgerCare Plus does not pay for inpatient hospital costs for services such as labor and delivery.

You can apply for regular BadgerCare Plus online at [access.wi.gov](http://access.wi.gov), by phone, mail or in person. Your health care provider can help you apply.
