We are a 24/7 inpatient program that provides interdisciplinary care for people with intellectual disabilities and complex medical needs.

We provide an evaluation and create an individualized treatment plan that supports the individual, their family, and their community team to achieve their functional goals. Our experts provide education to support individuals as they transition back to the community.

People in our program gain socialization skills and community integration opportunities through music therapy and therapeutic recreation.

School-aged clients receive individualized education services through our on-site Cardinal School, which is accredited by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

Eligibility

The Medical Short-Term Care Unit serves Wisconsin residents of all ages.

Clients must have a diagnosis of intellectual disability.

Admissions must be approved by the client's county of residence or their managed care organization.
