

Use Portable Generators Correctly



Portable generators are useful when temporary or remote electric power is needed. However, if used incorrectly, gasoline, kerosene, and other gaspowered generators can cause carbon monoxide poisoning, electric shocks, fires, and burns. Generator accidents can be fatal!

Protect Yourself and Your Family

Portable generator exhaust contains deadly carbon monoxide (CO) gas! You can't see or smell CO gas. With a few basic precautions, accidents can be prevented. Follow the safety tips below to protect yourself and your family:

- Only run your generator in a well-ventilated area.
 Make sure the exhaust hose is placed far from other campers, tents, boats, cabins, etc. Never run your generator in an enclosed area.
- Use portable carbon monoxide detectors in your RV, cabin of your boat, tent or other area where CO may be present.
- Only use a generator if you can vent its exhaust safely.
