#### Foreword

This report, *Wisconsin Deaths*, 2007, presents key information about deaths of Wisconsin residents that occurred in 2007 and previous years. Information is included on the number and rate of deaths overall and by age, sex and cause. *Wisconsin Deaths* has been published annually since the 1995 data year, and replaced the earlier report series *Vital Statistics* (data years 1984-1994), *Public Health Statistics* (1952-1983), and *Annual Report of Morbidity and Mortality* (1948-1951).

The source of data for this report is death certificates filed with the State Registrar, Vital Records Section, Bureau of Health Information and Policy (BHIP), Division of Public Health, Department of Health Services. (On July 1, 2008, the Department of Health and Family Services became the Department of Health Services and the new Department of Children and Families was created.)

The Bureau of Health Information and Policy would like to recognize the following: local Register of Deeds offices and the Milwaukee and West Allis city health offices (for registering deaths), coroners and medical examiners (for certifying causes of death), hospitals and physicians (for certifying deaths), and funeral directors (for filing death certificates). We would also like to acknowledge and thank other states and countries for submitting data on deaths of Wisconsin residents that occurred in those places.

The Department of Health Services produced this publication. Staff of the Vital Records Registration and Statistics Unit, Bureau of Health Information and Policy, collected and compiled the death records. 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#### Introduction

All tables and figures in this report present Wisconsin resident data (deaths of Wisconsin residents). This means that deaths have been assigned to the area where the person lived (usually legal residence), regardless of where the death occurred. Most of the deaths reported in this publication occurred in Wisconsin, although the State Vital Records Office receives death certificates of Wisconsin residents from other states and countries as well. (Reports of deaths that occurred outside Wisconsin are thought to be substantially complete.)

Chapter 69, Wisconsin Statutes, authorizes the Department of Health Services to supervise and direct the collection of death data. This statute also indicates how local registrars are to collect and file certificates for deaths that occur in their jurisdictions.

Beginning with 1999 data, causes of death have been coded using the International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision (ICD-10). ICD-10 replaced the ICD-9 that was used to code death data for the years 1979-1998. ICD-10 is a classification system that was developed collaboratively by the World Health Organization (WHO) and 10 international centers to reflect advances in medical science and changes in diagnostic terminology, and to promote international comparability in the presentation of mortality statistics.

A comparability table has been prepared to assist the reader in comparing numbers of deaths by cause between 1999 (and subsequent years) and the years before 1999. #### 2007 Wisconsin Death Report: Special Note (August 2008)

Just over 100 years ago, on October 1, 1907, registrations for all Wisconsin vital events (births, deaths, marriages and divorces) were required to be filed at the State level in the Wisconsin State Vital Records Office. Prior to that time, registration of these events at the county level in Wisconsin was voluntary (it was mandated by state statute in 1852 but not strictly enforced before 1880 or later) and vital records were not filed for most events. Vital events that were logged by counties prior to 1907 included minimal information. In 1907, counties submitted these logs to the State Vital Records Office for central recordkeeping.

### **Key Findings**

- In 2007, there were 46,117 deaths of Wisconsin residents, 66 more deaths than in 2006.
- In 2007, the Wisconsin death rate (deaths per 1,000 population) was 8.2.
- The Wisconsin death rate has been similar to the United States death rate every year since 1945.
- Age-specific death rates for males generally exceed death rates for females. However, among persons aged 80 and older, the number of female deaths is greater than the number of male deaths (even though male death rates remain generally higher). This is because many more females than males live past the age of 80.
- Cremations continued to increase as a percentage of total deaths, while burials continued to decrease. Cremations constituted 38 percent of dispositions in 2007 (compared to 36% in 2006 and 24% in 1998); burials constituted 54 percent of total deaths in 2007 (compared to 56% in 2006 and 66% in 1998).
- In 2007, an autopsy was performed in just 8 percent of deaths, compared with 14 percent in 1980.
- In 2007, a total of 58 deaths were reported on death certificates as due to injuries at work. This was higher than the number reported for 2006 (51).
- As in 2006, the three leading underlying causes of death in 2007 were diseases of the heart, malignant neoplasms (cancer) and cerebrovascular diseases (stroke). These three causes of death accounted for 54 percent of total deaths among Wisconsin residents.
- Accidents were the leading underlying cause of death among males ages 1-14, 15-24 and 25-44. Cancer was the leading cause of death among men ages 45-84.
- Accidents were the leading underlying cause of death among females ages 1-14 and 15-24. Cancer was the leading cause of death among women ages 25-84.
- Diseases of the heart and cancer were the two leading underlying causes of death in each race group. In 2007, diseases of the heart accounted for 20 percent of deaths among African Americans, 24 percent of deaths among whites, 18 percent of deaths among American Indians and 16 percent of deaths among Asians. Cancer accounted for 22 percent of deaths among African Americans, 24 percent of deaths among whites, 20 percent of deaths among American Indians and 19 percent of deaths among Asians.
- Accidents were the third leading cause of death among males of all races. Accidents accounted for 11
  percent of deaths among American Indian males, 11 percent of deaths among Asian males, 7 percent of
  deaths among white males and 9 percent among African American males.
- Among females in every race group, diseases of the heart and malignant neoplasms (cancer) were the two leading underlying causes of death in 2007.
- Malignant neoplasms and accidents were the leading causes of death among Hispanics/Latinos. In 2007, accidents accounted for 16 percent of deaths among Hispanics and 5 percent of deaths among non-Hispanics.
- There were 15 maternal deaths in 2007, the same number as in 2005 and 2006. Maternal deaths are deaths attributed to pregnancy-related health conditions or events of delivery.

• In 2007, death rates ranged from a low of 773.7 per 100,000 population in the Department of Health Services' Southern Region to a high of 928.3 in the Northern Region. Differences in the death rate by region reflect many factors, including the age distribution of the region's population.






Figure 1. Heart Disease Death Rates by Selected Age Groups and Sex, Wisconsin 2007

• Death rates from diseases of the heart for males exceeded rates for females in all age groups.



- In an unusual occurrence in 2007, malignant neoplasms surpassed heart disease as the leading cause of death for Wisconsin males. This change reflects continuing decline in the death rate for heart disease, and a stable or increasing rate of death from cancer.
- Accidents were the leading underlying cause of death among males ages 1-14, 15-24 and 25-44. Cancer was the leading cause of death among men ages 45-84.
- Suicide was the second leading cause of death among males ages 15-44.
- For males aged 45 and older, cancer and heart disease were the two leading causes of death. Cancer was the leading cause for men ages 45-84, and heart disease was the leading cause for men ages 85 and older.

#### **Technical Notes**

#### **Reporting Requirements**

As specified in Chapter 69, Wisconsin Statutes, the following is a brief outline of the sequence of events that take place when a death occurs in Wisconsin:

- Within 24 hours after being notified of a death, the filing party (usually a funeral director) must present a certificate of death to the physician or medical examiner responsible for completing and signing the medical certification.
- The medical certifier has six days after pronouncement of death to return the certificate of death back to the filing party.
- Within two days after receipt of the medical certification, the filing party must present the death certificate to the registration district (local Register of Deeds or City Health Office).
- There should be no more than nine calendar days total from date of death until filing at a local office.
- The local Register of Deeds or City Health Office must transmit the death certificate to the State Registrar within ten working days (not including weekends) after its receipt from the filing party.
- State statute allows up to 21 days from the date of death for notification to the State Registrar.

#### International Classification of Disease (ICD-10) Codes

Causes of death for deaths that occurred in 2007 have been coded according to the World Health Organization's *International Classification of Diseases—Tenth Revision* (Geneva, Switzerland, 1992). This classification system is the current standard used by the National Center for Health Statistics. All of the cause-of-death groupings utilized in this report were recommended for state use by the National Center for Health Statistics and the World Health Organization.
