FINANCIAL RESOURCES

Community Care / Charity Care / Hardship Funds: Most health care providers have a system in place designed to assist individuals who cannot afford medical services. These programs typically require the client to complete an application including financial and income information. Based on eligibility requirements, which vary from program to program, client charges may be significantly reduced. Information on these programs can be obtained directly from the health care provider's financial office. It is also important to remember that terms of payment can be negotiated with health care providers in advance of services. For example: a client may only be able to afford \$20/month and this can be arranged directly with the provider.
