PROFILE DESCRIPTION: These funds provide reimbursement for a percentage of costs incurred for Family Care, Family Care Partnership, or PACE members admitted to an Institution for Mental Disease (IMD) through an emergency detention under s. 51.15, Stats. during the contract period. The funds are available only for costs incurred after the first 72 hours of a member's stay at an IMD and only for members whose IMD services are not covered by Medicaid, Medicare, or another form of insurance.

The county must also contact each member's MCO and county of placement, if applicable, to offer to participate in Chapter 34 crisis planning for each member for whom the county is requesting reimbursement. In addition, counties must submit a signed Request for IMD Rebalancing Initiative Funding – Summary Form and a Request for IMD Rebalancing Initiative Funding – Detail by Member Form within 30 days of the end of the contract period.

The IMD RI funding will be allocated based on each county's percentage of total reimbursement requested by all participating counties and eligible under this initiative. The county's percentage of total requested

reimbursement will be calculated by dividing the county's reimbursement request by the total reimbursement requested from all counties participating in the IMD Rebalancing Initiative. Actual reimbursement to each county shall not exceed 50% of the county's reimbursement request.
