PROFILE DESCRIPTION: The funding is through the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant under CFDA 93.959. Prior to FFY 16, the program was called "Brighter Futures." The name of this program will now be "Substance Abuse Prevention."

Substance abuse remains a serious problem on the Menominee Indian Reservation with youth particularly at risk due to ongoing substance use by family members, domestic violence in the family, negative peer pressure, affects from historical trauma and low community, cultural participation and engagement. Funding provided through the Tribal Substance Abuse Prevention Program aims to prevent and reduce the incidence of youth alcohol and other drug use and abuse in the Menominee community by using evidence-based programs and practices. This is accomplished through evidence-based classroom-based prevention education classes offered throughout the school year, parent

education workshops and culturally-specific wellness activities. Expected outcomes are a decrease in AODA usage by 6th -12th graders, delaying the onset of AODA in all youth, increasing youth participation in prevention programs and healthier families through improved parenting.
