Smoke or heat detection


Every space you can walk into

Sprinklers

First line of defense against fires

Simple, reliable, and automatic

Utilizes inexpensive agent


DHS 83.64 (4) and DHS 83.48 (8)

Sprinklers

CBRF's that are sprinkler protected
6 x greater occupant safety
2 x less property damage

Sprinklers do not put fires out Sprinkler control a fire

Sprinklers



Storage

CBRF's shall be free of hazards

Storage areas shall be safe, dry, and orderly

DHS 83.45 (1)(d) and (2)

Heaters

CBRF's shall be free of hazards

Portable space heaters are prohibited

DHS 83.46 (1) (b) and DHS 83.45

Laundry

CBRF's shall be free of hazards

Clothes dryer vent tubing shall be rigid material

DHS 83.44 (1) (c) and DHS 83.45
