The RN/MD equivalency application should be completed by the RN/MD. An operational plan must be submitted to the state for the utilization of an RN/MD.

Is this being done statewide? • Does any program other than SALT currently adopt all of the MUCC Guidelines? • Update on the initiative 	Jerry Biggart	Need to update the EMS website with information on SALT tags. The state needs to identify if SALT is MUCC compliant. Will address with senior leadership if it should be added to state statute.	MCI's, triage tags, MUCC compliance, patient tracking, etc. are all areas of discussion. SALT is the only tag that is MUCC compliant. Because Wisconsin is home rule, this may need to be medical director driven.
Access to Data Outcome	Jerry Biggart		EMS would like data information outcomes. This measurable data would help to work toward improvements such as response times. The Trauma Coordinators can provide this information to the EMS providers. WARDS reports should be used for time on scene data. The state trauma system is moving over to the same vendor as WARDS to link the two systems to provide ease with patient tracking.
DHS110 Credentialing EMS Providers	Jerry Biggart		In DHS rule 110, the EMS provider must work under a medical director. The intent of the rule is to ensure that EMS personnel are practicing with an EMS license. It was not intended for a medical director to remove personnel because of indifferences.
