# 2024 Tribal Dementia Care Specialist Contract Grant/Contract Deliverables and Expectations

#### Name of Organization: Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians

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#### Background

In 2015, three tribal dementia care specialist positions were originally funded through a one-time grant process. The 2017-19 Biennial Budget (2017 Wisconsin Act 59) provided funding to maintain ongoing support for the three tribal dementia care specialists. The 2019-21 Biennial Budget (2019 Wisconsin Act 9) provided ongoing funding for one additional tribal dementia care specialist position. As of the 2021-2023 Biennial Budget (2021 Wisconsin Act 58), funding was provided to expand the Tribal DCS Program to all eleven (11) federally recognized tribes in Wisconsin.

## **Generalized Funding Statement**

\$80,000 will be provided to each of the eleven federally recognized tribes. This funding will support one full-time Tribal Dementia Care Specialist position for each tribe. This funding will be used for dementia care specialist positions, related programming, training, technology, and supplies.

Federal Medicaid administration matching funds are available. To access these additional funds, DCS are required to complete 100% time and task reporting.

## Scope of Work Summary

Deliverables of the **designated tribal agency** include, but are not limited to, the following major activities consistent with the Tribal Dementia Care Specialist Program requirements:

- *Hire a full-time Tribal Dementia Care Specialist (Memory Care Coordinator) with training and experience working with tribal members with dementia and family caregivers.*
- Designate a supervisor who is able to provide guidance and oversight to the dementia care specialist.
- Provide orientation and ongoing training in conjunction with the Department.
- Develop detailed budgets for the use of program funds, including any contractual services, for each year.
- Ensure that the dementia care specialist has technology and materials needed to fulfill job duties.

Deliverables of the **dementia care specialist** include, but are not limited to, the following major activities consistent with the Tribal Dementia Care Specialist Program requirements:

- Attend training offered for Tribal Dementia Care Specialists provided by the Department.
- Participate in ongoing training and collaborative meetings offered by the Department, tribal agencies, ADRCs and Alzheimer's and dementia organizations.

- Provide information and assistance to people with dementia and their caregivers regarding topics including, but not limited to:
  - Information and education about dementia, communication strategies, and safety considerations.
  - Assistance with advanced and ongoing care planning.
  - *Referral to support groups, respite care providers, memory cafes, research opportunities, and other community resources.*
- Engage in marketing and outreach to inform tribal leadership, health systems and members about services available through the Tribal DCS.
- Provide outreach and education to tribal members about dementia and the needs of family caregivers.
- Provide memory screens in accordance with the memory screening manual published by DHS.
- Train appropriate tribal departments and services to be dementia-capable.
- Partner with community organizations to create a dementia-friendly tribe and community, including enhancing relationships with health and long-term care systems, health care professionals, emergency responders, mental health systems, crisis teams, schools and other community organizations and businesses.
- Coordinate with other Alzheimer's and dementia organizations serving the Tribe.
- Develop programs that will create opportunities for tribal members with dementia to remain living safely in their own homes.
- Present at local, regional and statewide workshops and conferences to provide updates about the tribe's experiences and lessons learned from implementing the Tribal Dementia Care Specialist Program.
- Collect required data and provide regular verbal and written updates to the Tribal Dementia Care Specialist program manager in accordance to reporting requirements outlined by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services.
