Name of Organization: **2024 Tribal Contract: GLITC, Potawatomi and Ho-Chunk**

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Background

The Title V Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services Block Grant creates Federal-State-Local partnerships to develop state and local systems to meet the critical challenges facing women, children and families. States are required to use at least 30% of the Title V Block Grant funds for preventive and primary care programs serving all children; and at least another 30% of these funds must support programs for children and youth with special health care needs. Tribal agencies are in the most opportune position to work with community and state partners to improve and reach goals identified by the MCH Program.

Funding for GLITC, Potawatomi, and Ho-Chunk

MCH Contract: Total: \$244,006 (GLITC=\$186,325; Potawatomi=\$18,528; Ho-Chunk=\$39,150)

Scope of Work Summary

Tribal agency self-selects one or more MCH Objectives—**social connections, breastfeeding, developmental screening, adolescent well-being, health equity and community engagement, perinatal mental health and physical activity and nutrition**. Each objective identifies specific strategies that the Tribal agency must implement. Strategies are evidence-based and evidence-informed. Resources and tools are available from statewide projects and partners who will provide technical assistance to agencies in implementing the required strategies.

Additional required activities include:

- Implement and evaluate effectiveness of the selected strategies and activities
- Collaborate with community partners
- Participate in quarterly Learning Community meetings/calls
- Attend MCH Summit depending on year
