Name of Organization: **2017 Tribal Contract**

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Background

The federal Preventive Health and Health Services (PHHS) Block Grant provides funding to address health problems, prevent diseases and promote health in Wisconsin. In 2014, Wisconsin received approximately \$3 million through this grant to fund health programs statewide.

PHHS Block Grant funds enable Wisconsin to provide flexible funding to address the highest priority health issues in communities. Funds are provided to the State's 87 local health departments and 11 tribal health agencies.

The PHHS Block Grant supports capacity building and core service development in various areas. Prevention funds can augment limited categorical program funds at the state or local level.

Funding Per Tribe or Generalized Funding Statement

In FFY15 \$38,390 was allocated directly to tribal contracts from Wisconsin's PHHS BG funding. That amount is divided equally to total \$3,490 per tribe.

The funding for 2017 budget has not been finalized; a small increase is anticipated but will not be finalized until July.

Scope of Work Summary

The PHHS Block Grant gives grantees the flexibility to prioritize the use of funds to:

- Address emerging health issues and gaps.
- Decrease premature death and disabilities by focusing on the leading preventable risk factors.
- Work to achieve health equity and eliminate health disparities by addressing the social determinants of health.
- Support local programs to achieve healthy communities.
- Establish data and surveillance systems to monitor the health status of targeted populations.
- Improve infrastructure, build capacity, and achieve accreditation through implementation of effective programmatic and administrative areas central to the health department's objectives.

Success is achieved by:

- Using evidence-based methods and interventions.
- Reducing risk factors.
- Establishing policy, social, and environmental changes.
- Leveraging other funds.
- Continuing to monitor progress towards selected outcomes and re-evaluate funded activities.
- Reflecting Healthy People 2020 and Healthiest Wisconsin 2020 objectives in project objectives.

In 2015 (the 2015 – 2017 funding period) each agency will again be required to have the National Public Health Performance Standards objective and must include information on the work they will be doing to implement national public health performance standards and best practices to advance voluntary public health accreditation readiness and maintenance. However, in response to concerns about local fiscal requirements, **agencies will have discretion in deciding the amount of funding assigned to that objective up to their full allocation.** The supplemental funding that had been targeted to this work in 2015 has been combined with the agencies’ base funding for 2016.
