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Background

The United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service (USDA-FNS) provides funds to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). The WIC, Farmers Market Nutrition and Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Programs are administered by the Division of Public Health (DPH), in the Bureau of Community Health Promotion (BCHP), WIC, and Nutrition Section. At the local level, the three programs are administered through health departments, private non-profit agencies and tribal health agencies.

Funding Per Tribe (2016) or Generalized Funding Statement

The funding is based on four allocation factors: caseload or participation numbers, race/ethnicity, women & infants and geographic area of the project/square mileage.

Scope of Work Summary

WIC is a federal prevention program which provides a nutrition assessment (including health screening), nutrition and breastfeeding education, health information, referrals to health and social services, and supplemental foods to eligible individuals as funding levels permit. Pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, infants, and children less than age 5 years are categorically eligible to participate in the WIC Program. Income eligibility requirements for the WIC Program extend to 185% of poverty (or higher, per “adjunctive eligibility” with other programs such as FoodShare). Other eligibility criteria include Wisconsin residency, proof of pregnancy, and an identified nutrition risk factor.

The WIC FMNP is a separate USDA program that provides WIC families food instruments to buy fruits, vegetables, and herbs at approved farmers’ markets and approved farm stand.

The Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program provides ongoing breastfeeding promotion and support efforts by peers to enhance WIC Program goals of increasing breastfeeding among WIC participants.

Contract Period of Performance:

The contract period is a calendar year. January 1 – December 31.
