

Keeping Kids Covered



Is your income too high to keep your BadgerCare Plus or other Medicaid benefits? Have you had other changes that affect your program membership? Even if you no longer qualify, your kids can stay covered and get the care they need for good health.

How it Works

Children under age 19 who are enrolled in a qualifying program as of January 1, 2024, will have coverage for 12 months from their last application or renewal.

For example, if your family is already enrolled and did your renewal in October 2023, your kids will have benefits at least through September 2024. Their health insurance continues until then, even if your income increases or you no longer meet program rules.

New households enrolling on or after January 1, 2024, will also have 12 months of continued benefits for kids under age 19.

Exceptions

Continuous coverage does not apply to children:

- Enrolled under presumptive eligibility, also known as Express Enrollment.
- Required to meet a deductible to enroll in BadgerCare Plus or Medicaid.

There are a few things that can end a child's coverage during the 12-month period:

- They turn 19.
- They move out of Wisconsin.
- Their citizenship or immigration status is not verified.
- The family asks to end their coverage.
